SAINT-BONIFACE, May 19th, 2015 –Fort Gibraltar is officially re-opening its doors to the public today, thus launching the tenth consecutive season of its summer historical interpretive centre. Guided tours will be offered until August 30th. Tourists will have the opportunity to immerse themselves through history to get acquainted with the bygone times of the Red River Colony.

Travel back in time to the year 1815, to the fur trade era and meet the colourful characters who lived in and around Fort Gibraltar. The bilingual and animated interpreters will explore with you the blacksmith shop, the trading post, the workshop, the campfire, the warehouse and the winterers' cabin, where you will learn about the daily chores, traditions and hobbies of the inhabitants of Fort Gibraltar as well as the bitter rivalry between the two fur trading giants; the Northwest and Hudson's Bay companies.

Fort Gibraltar will offer, for the very first time, Voyageur Apprenticeship Workshops during the summer season! About Fort Gibraltar:

Originally built at the forks of the Red and Assiniboine rivers in 1810, Fort Gibraltar was a North West Company fur trade post erected to control the region's pemmican traffic. Festival du Voyageur Inc. built the existing fort in Saint-Boniface on the bank of the Red River, in 1978.
